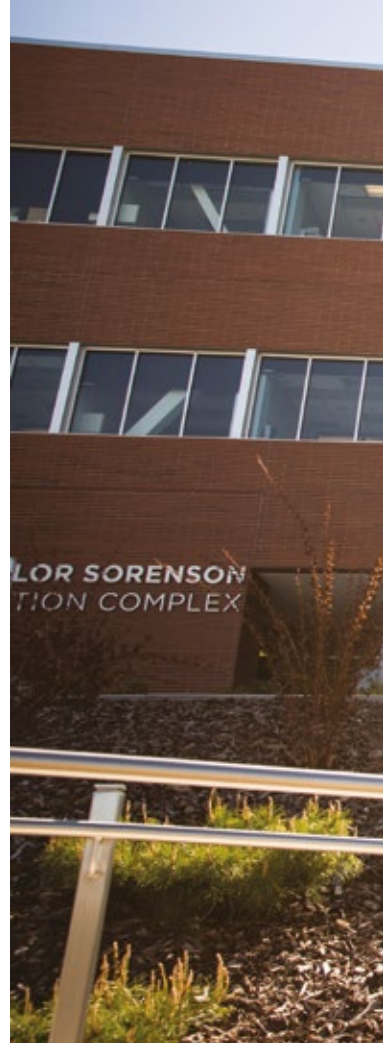

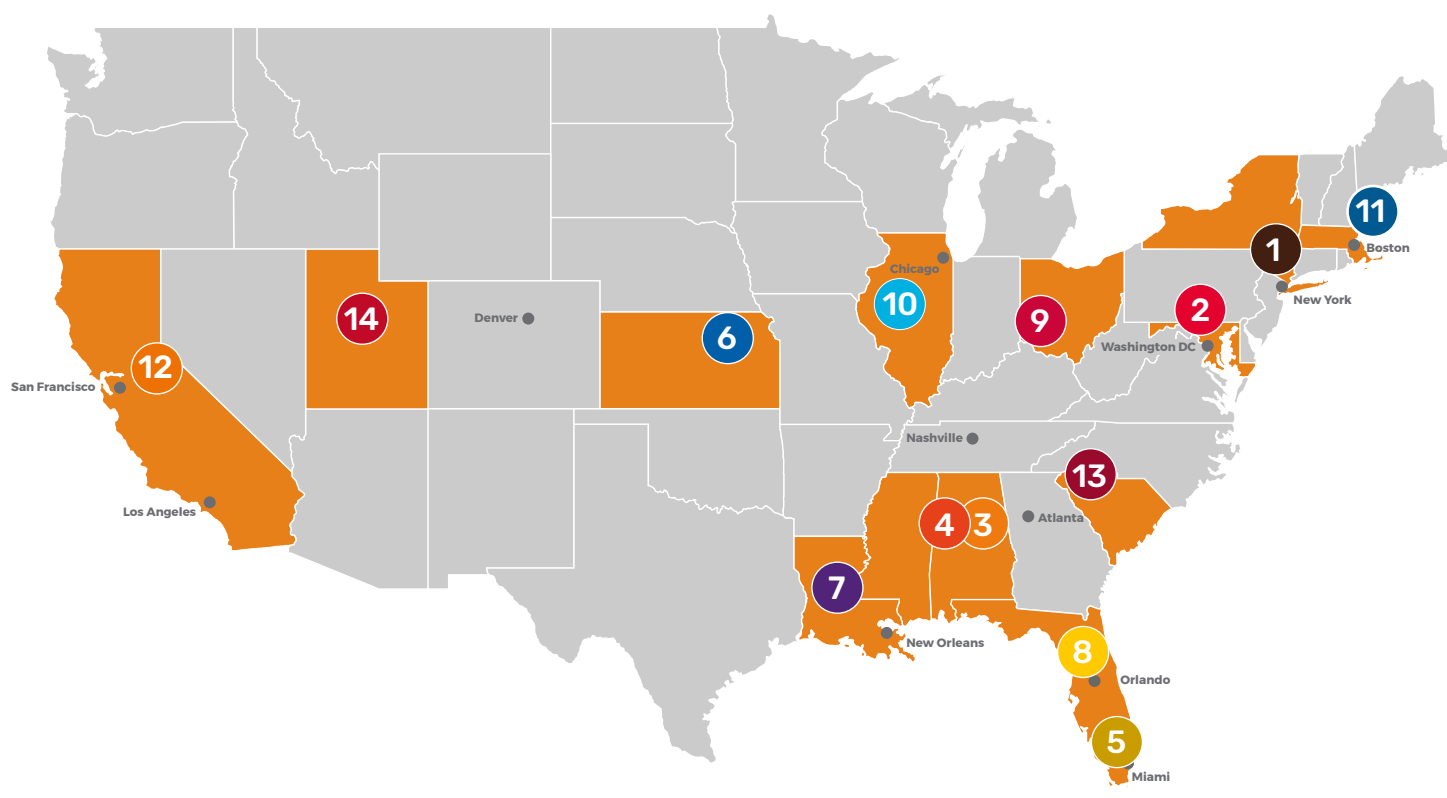

The **Career Accelerator** gives students the competitive edge to be successful in today's professional world.

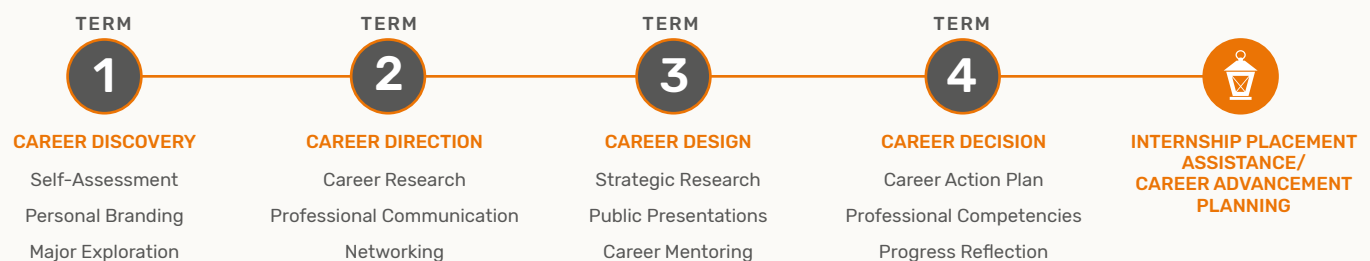
Created by professional career coaches, the Career Accelerator offers students the ability to customize their program in line with their professional goals. Each student's dedicated Career Advisor works with them to provide the training and skills needed by today's global employers.

We appreciate that life as a student is busy. The Career Accelerator spans four semesters so that students can easily participate in the program while managing their studies. During this time, students participate in a series of interactive career-related workshops and events.

Classroom and external activities are supported by one-on-one appointments with an assigned Career Advisor to help students achieve their career goals. To complement this universal employability and academic development curriculum, additional activities will be arranged, such as employer panels, motivational speakers, topical seminars, group work, and tutorials. Career Accelerator students who complete the program are able to market themselves successfully to employers. Career Advisors leverage their expertise to help each student identify and obtain opportunities that will lead to their next great job.

/ PROGRAM MODULES AND SELECTED TRAININGS

Through Career Accelerator modules and workshops, students will explore a variety of personal and professional development themes that assess and develop their competence as productive, 21st-century workplace team members.





Live, Learn Grow.

Depending on the student's specific program track, they will take either one, two, or three semesters of the Undergraduate Accelerator's signature course: **Live, Learn, Grow**. The course curriculum's skills-based and experiential approach is critical to students' personal and professional growth, and helps to ensure their success in the Accelerator Program and beyond.

- Acquire essential information for day-to-day life at the university that helps students navigate their immediate physical and emotional surroundings and immerse themselves deeper into the university community.
- Students become well-rounded, autonomous scholars by exploring the individual nature of learning and employing active-learning exercises to demonstrate effective learning strategies.
- Students share their experiences; document growth; and articulate personal, academic, and professional goals through a capstone video project, while simultaneously building technical skills through the use of mixed-media tools and techniques.

Routes of Entry.

With our partner universities, we have created a suite of programs that have at their heart a curriculum that is both challenging and engaging, driven by the goal of creating a world-class, meaningful student experience.

INTERNATIONAL DIRECT

Many of our partnerships offer the international direct admissions process. This admissions process is a unique and streamlined approach for placing students into the optimal academic entry level to promote long-term educational success.

Once a student applies, they will be accepted to the university and the program that best meets their academic and English-language qualifications. This includes admittance via direct admission, pathway, and pre-session English programs.

Through the international direct admissions process, students and their counselors will benefit from a transparent application process, personalized assistance at every step, and pre-arrival support. This includes access to our online Admissions Portal, which provides you with the ability to easily view application status, missing documents, and all other requirements through all phases of the admissions process, up to a student's arrival On campus.

Students who apply through the international direct admissions process and have the academic qualifications and English-language proficiency required for direct entry will be able to enroll directly into the university and be fully immersed in their degree program as soon as they arrive on campus.

ACCELERATOR PROGRAMS

Offered at both the undergraduate and postgraduate levels, the Accelerator Program that's right for your students will depend on their academic background, level of English-language proficiency, and personal preferences.

The Undergraduate Accelerator Programs are comprised of three distinct tracks:

- Academic Accelerator Program (AAP) – 2 Semesters
- Extended Accelerator Program (EAP) – 3 Semesters
- Pre-Sessional English (with progression into the EAP upon successful completion)

The Master's Accelerator Programs are comprised of four distinct tracks:

- Direct Master's Accelerator Program (Direct MAP)
- Advanced Master's Accelerator Program (Advanced MAP) – 1 Semester
- Master's Accelerator Program (MAP) – 2 Semesters
- Pre-Sessional English (with progression into MAP upon successful completion)

Regardless of entry route, the following facets of the program combine to create a learning-centered environment that promotes academic success, active involvement in campus life, and community engagement:

- Flexibility to change majors and explore interests
- Academic advising
- Dedicated student services team
- Small class sizes
- American cultural experiences

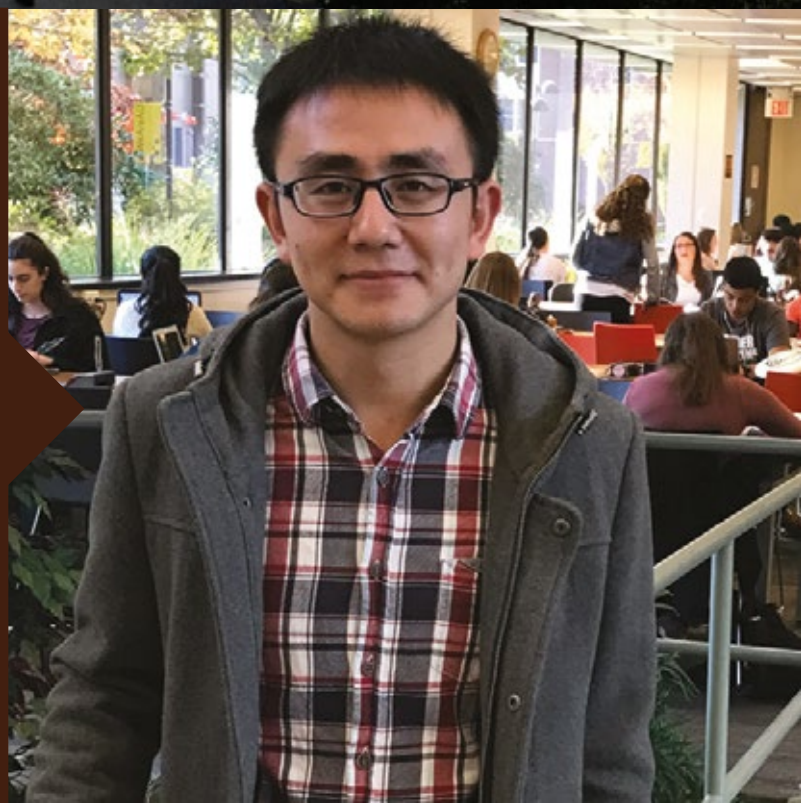

Adelphi University (ADU) is dedicated to expanding global awareness through education and communication. With a special relationship with the United Nations, study abroad programs, and sponsored events of the International Leadership Coordinating Committee, ADU is committed as an engaged university in the world community.

ADU is located in historic Garden City, New York, with centers in Manhattan, Poughkeepsie, and Su Old County. Garden City combines the excitement of an urban center (including parks, shopping centers, and restaurants) with the charm of a small residential community. ADU is 23 miles away from New York City and Yankee Stadium, Citi Field, Barclays Center, Madison Square Garden, Times Square, Metropolitan Museum of Art, and LaGuardia and John F. Kennedy International airports. ADU's diverse international student body consists of 5,000 undergraduate and 2,600 graduate and doctoral students. ADU's faculty includes internationally renowned scientists, artists, critics, and scholars, and there is an overall student-to-faculty ratio of 10:1.

ADU is proud of its tradition of international interest and service. In 2003, the United Nations approved ADU as a non-governmental organization (NGO). This means ADU students are invited to attend weekly briefings at the UN and also participate in the annual National Model United Nations Collegiate Conference.

Complementing university-sponsored social activities are political and cultural events that broaden knowledge and foster dialogue about global issues. Recent guests have included primatologist Jane Goodall, historian Diane Ravitch, and New York Times columnist Thomas Friedman.

There are 23 intercollegiate athletic teams, and ADU's state-of-the-art facilities include the Performing Arts Center (AUPAC) and the Center for Recreation and Sports— host to numerous cultural, wellness, and athletic events— that provide students with a well-rounded education.

Getting involved is a great way for students to make the most of the ADU experience. For example, students can take pictures for the Oracle (ADU's yearbook), write for The Delphian (ADU's newspaper), participate in the International Student Society, mentor freshman students, or volunteer at a soup kitchen.

How to Apply.

STEP 1



Student completes their application

Email the student's completed application to the respective university partnership.

STEP 2



Submit official transcripts

The student's original transcripts must be viewed by an authorised recruiter, public notary, or regional office and be certified. Once certified, these can be scanned and emailed to the university partnership.

STEP 3



Submit proof of English language ability

If the student's native language is not English, please submit proof of their English-language ability. A full list of accepted tests can be found on the university partnership website.

STEP 4



Provide Certification of Finances

After the student's conditional offer is received, the student needs to submit the documents requested in the offer. The student must also provide a Certificate of Finances and accompanying documentation from the student's bank showing sufficient funds for the program.

STEP 5



Apply for Visa

Once the student has been officially admitted to a program, the relevant admissions team will send the documents required to apply for visa processing with the U.S. Embassy in your country.
